Mental Health Support Program after Disasters in Japanese Setting

Abstract: Devastating Kobe earthquake happened in 1995 roused public awareness of the survivors' mental health issues, and trauma-related disorders such as PTSD attracted wide concern for the first time in Japan. Since then, mental health support services came to be planned and provided after

many types of disasters by the local or relevant levels of government. These services' current conditions, together with a few research results we conducted, and their implication for service improvement, will be presented.
